

## A Quick Guide to News Values in NewsArcade

In NewsArcade you will encounter several **news values.** Below is a short explanation of what each stands for and the kind of feedback that can be given if two of them are combined.

Analytical	<ul> <li>→ Focus on documentation and validation</li> <li>→ Investigation and research are key values</li> <li>→ Quality newspapers tradition - background stories</li> </ul>
Confrontational	<ul> <li>→ Focus on opposite interests and disagreement</li> <li>→ Action and consequences are key values</li> <li>→ Tabloid tradition – strong headlines</li> </ul>
Empathetic	<ul> <li>→ Focus on proximity and familiarity</li> <li>→ Human interest and personalization are key values</li> <li>→ TV tradition – case stories</li> </ul>
Entertaining	<ul> <li>→ Focus on prominence and oddity</li> <li>→ Fascination and superlativeness are key values</li> <li>→ Magazine tradition – quality photography</li> </ul>
Impactful	<ul> <li>→ Focus on amount of people affected and amplitude</li> <li>→ Publicity and politics are key values</li> <li>→ Public service media tradition – usually dealt as cover story</li> </ul>
Constructive	<ul> <li>→ Focus on consonance and solutions</li> <li>→ Optimism and collaboration are key values</li> <li>→ Vertical media tradition – specialised stories/ strong angle</li> </ul>
Surprising	<ul> <li>→ Focus on unexpectedness and impression</li> <li>→ Curiosity and originality are key values</li> <li>→ Social Media tradition - fun facts used to build narrative</li> </ul>
Trending	<ul> <li>→ Focus on frontrunning agendas and vogue phenomena</li> <li>→ Topicality and timeliness are key values</li> <li>→ Op-ed tradition - lifestyle, social media</li> </ul>





















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
